Dear Fellow DLOG Member,

Enthusiasm and anticipation are in the air as the Denver Lyric Opera Guild prepares for it annual Competition for Colorado Singers. If you are a new member who has not yet experienced this amazing Master Class and Competition, you are in for a treat!

Encouraging and supporting young singers is DLOG's primary objective. The Competition is a chance for the singers to experience coaching from a renowned voice teacher, to win cash awards (\$31,500 last year), and to perform before a panel of qualified judges. This is a chance of a lifetime for many of these young singers!

The purpose of my letter is twofold. First, to ask you to SAVE THE DATES for this year's Competition. The Master Class is Saturday, February 6, 2016, and will be conducted by Dr. Robert Harrison, formerly of CU Boulder and Jacobs School of Music at Indiana University. The Master Class offers members the opportunity to hear each young singer perform an aria, receive coaching from Dr. Harrison, then repeat the aria. It is such a wonderful learning experience, both for the singers and for the audience. Also, save Saturday, February 13 and Saturday, March 5 for the Preliminaries and Finals, respectively. Let me emphasize that all three days are FREE and open to the public! Plan to bring your friends and family!

My second purpose is to ask you to contribute to the Competition. As you are aware DLOG's investments have suffered from the economic climate since 2008. Members are encouraged to sponsor an award of \$1000 or more in their name or in memory of a loved one. # LIVERPOOL CARD GROUP!!!

### WANTED: MORE CARD PLAYERS

**WHY?** The purpose of the group **is** to accumulate \$1,000 each year for a Competition winner's award and for our own fun, enjoyment, and camaraderie. Each player contributes \$10 (a tax deductible donation) each month.

WHAT IS LIVERPOOL? A fun and easy to learn rummy game—it takes about five minutes. Eleven cards are dealt to each person. The game consists of melding various combinations of books (three of a kind like three eights, etc.) or runs (four consecutive cards of the same suit). After melding the players play on each other's cards until one person goes out (has no more cards left in his/her hand). The people left with cards count so many points for each card. Play ends around 3:00 or 3:30 p.m. The person with the lowest score wins the day pot (50 cents per player).

WHEN AND WHERE? The group meets at 11:30 a.m on the fourth Tuesday of the month. Each month one of the players acts as the host making arrangements with a place to meet (usually a restaurant) where we first enjoy lunch (each paying for his/her own lunch) and conversation. On November 24, 2015, we will be meeting at the Fresh Fish Company on east Hampden near Tamarac in the same shopping center as Whole Foods and Wells Fargo on the south side of the street.
