We hope you can join us on the Boomer Bus that will take you directly to the front of the Opera House, arriving at 11:45 a.m. The bus leaves from near the corner of Colorado Boulevard and Alameda Avenue directly in front of the newly relocated Bed Bath and Beyond. It stops to pick up people who live on the west side of town at the parking lot at the bottom of the Simms Landing Steak House on 6th Avenue, leaving that location at 10:45 a.m. You can look forward to a talk about this opera on the ride up the mountain. The melodies from IL TROVATORE are probably more widely known than those of any other opera. The most familiar is the Anvil Chorus.

Shortly after arrival you will be served lunch in the Teller House, after which you will be treated to a "behind the scenes" experience. Opera Notes, an additional talk about the opera, begins across the street in Williams Stables at 1:45 p.m. It is too early to know who the speaker will be, but it is often the Director or Stage Manager of the show, and the talk always includes more pertinent insights about what you are about to see and hear. If you prefer to purchase your tickets separate from the bus tour and drive yourself, that option is open to you.

## **COMPETITION WINNERS AND WRAP-UP**

Thanks to a long and thoughtful search by Barbara Walton, our VP of Competition, we were able to move the annual DLOG Competition to Calvary Baptist Church this year. It proved to be an excellent venue, which we look forward to using for years to come. Bringing the 2018 Competition to fruition took a year-long effort, beginning shortly after the April, 2017 Opera on Tuesday awards luncheon.

Now Karen Bruggenthies—who serves as both Candidate Chair and Competition Vice President—is already preparing for the 2019 Competition. Karen is very experienced in both positions and enjoys getting to know these young singers who have a true commitment to their art. As Candidate Chair for the past year, Karen carefully shepherded qualified singers through the process leading to acceptance as competition participants. She prepared those who expressed interest in participation in the Master Class. She was there, behind the stage, ushering singers to their performances at both the Preliminaries and the Finals (March 10 and March 14, 2018).

Jeremy Reger was the accompanist and teacher of the Master Class. He focused on both coaching the individual singers and informing the audience about the process.

Scott Finlay, charged with selecting judges, did a wonderful job again this year, finding people who were willing to serve as judges for both the Preliminaries (John Arida, Dr. Anne Gross and Evelyn Petros) and the Finals (Maestro Craig Kier, Alison Moritz and Edward Parks). Jackie Writz again handled the Candidate Check-in with her team, many of whom have worked with her on this for several years. All the committees contributed in meaningful ways.

Barbara Walton handled the contract with Penguin Digital, Inc. who recorded all the Finalists' performances and printed CDs that were given to each of the Finalists and to the donors who provided the prize money.

Marie Belew Wheatley welcomed our audiences at all of the Competition events and Barbara Walton introduced the judges and kept the audiences informed of the schedule and any additional information they needed to have.

## WHERE ARE THEY NOW?

Margaret Ozaki Graves is a soprano with "an absolutely huge voice that is crystal clear," wrote OPUS Colorado. All of us who have heard her sing—and many of us have, since she was a three-time prize winner in our Competitions (2004, 2005, and 2007)—look forward to being in the audience for many future performances.

Recently Meg premiered in West Side Story with the Boulder Philharmonic and sang the title role in Orpheus and Euridice. Since 2016, she has debuted at Lyric Opera of Chicago, Opera Steamboat and Arizona Opera, made concert premiers with Colorado Springs Philharmonic, Aurora Symphony, and Lone Tree Arts Center, and appeared with the Colorado Music Festival and the Denver Municipal Band. She has also sung at the Aspen Music Festival, That is an eclectic list!

Three of her favorite roles have been Mimi in La Boheme with

Loveland Opera Theatre, Lilli Vanessi in Kiss Me Kate with CenterStage Theater / Evergreen Chorale, and Jenny in Company with Equinox Theatre. Recent collaborations included duo concerts with mezzo-soprano lvy Walz, tenor Humberto Borboa (a DLOG favorite), and bass-baritone Christopher Herrera. She also performed in a mixed recital, Outsiders, with Denver Art Song Project's tenor Eapen Leubner, baritone John Seesholtz and pianist Mallory Bernstein. Meg was a jump-in soloist at Lyric Opera Studio Weimar, Germany.

Meg is an alumna of the University of Cincinnati College-Conservatory of Music. Lawrence University is where she earned her undergraduate degree. She was a Guest Instructor in Voice at University of Wisconsin Milwaukee in the Fall of 2017, and this Spring, 2018 is Assistant Professor of Voice at Ithaca College (as a sabbatical replacement). She has been published in NATS (National Association of Teachers of Singing), presented work at the Midwest Conference for East Asian Studies at Miami University, and is a contributing author for publications by AGMA (American Guild of Musical Artists) and the Japanese American Resource Center of Colorado.
