She performed as Hansel (*Hansel and Gretel*) and Carmen (*Carmen*) in Opera Colorado's touring productions. During her first season with Opera Colora-

do, she debuted as Flora (*La Traviata*), Gertrude Stein in Tom Cipullo's *A er Life*, sang a performance of Cherubino in Mozart's timeless masterpiece *e Marriage of Figaro*, and she was also featured as Stéphano (*Romeo and Juliet*) and Hansel (*Hansel and Gretel*) in Opera Colorado's touring productions. Kira has been an Apprentice Artist with Central City Opera singing Zweite Dame (*Die Zauber öte*) and Mercédès (*Carmen*), and was featured in their Al Fresco series this past summer. She hails from Petaluma, California and earned her Artist Diploma and Master of Music from Roosevelt University: Chicago College of Performing Arts and her Bachelor of Music from the University of Southern California.

# **Donating your IRA Distributions to Support the 2021 Competition**

Please consider donating some of your Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) to support the Guild's **2021 Competition for Colorado Singers.** IRA holders, age 70½ or older, can donate to DLOG from your Traditional or Roth IRA (including inherited) <u>tax-free.</u> Checks must be issued by <u>December 31st</u> in order to apply to the current calendar year. If a Money Market check is written, it will apply to the year in which it is cashed by the charity.

Contact your investment or financial advisor to request the funds be issued from your Traditional or Roth IRA as a QCD. You will need to discuss liquidating securities if the account does not have cash and/or money market funds available.

Checks should be made payable to **Denver Lyric Opera Guild** and mailed to P.O. Box 339, Englewood, CO 80151. Notify Lisa Curtis, Development VP, that a check will be issued, and asking for a mailed receipt to you upon DLOG receiving the funds.

#### Happy Birthday, Kathleen Estes!

Kathleen Estes, a long-time member of DLOG, celebrated her 100th Birthday on September 23rd by hosting a drive by and a front lawn party for former students, friends and neighbors...with everyone wearing masks. Kathleen has been known to explore the many, many topics in which she is interested. This included knowing which quarterbacks were doing their best and when they ought to be traded...and she doesn't mind sharing this info with you. From an early age her faith has been an important of her life. She would often drive up I 70 in her silver Subaru to see the growth and new sites the mountains had to offer. Watching the building of the Anschutz Medical Center in Aurora was of special interest to her and she drove there often to see its progress.

Her music studies in both voice and piano were begun with her Mother who had studied at the Cincinnati College of Music. Her Mother's collegiate voice teacher was also a vocal coach at the Metropolitan Opera Company. Kathleen went to school at Trinity University in San Antonio, TX during the Great Depression. She sang at an event where the College President heard her and he offered her a full ride scholarship. She had the opportunity to sing in several operas and was the soprano soloist in Handel's "Messiah". On coming to Denver with her husband, Dabney, she finished her degree in elementary education at the University of Colorado Boulder. She then taught 5th grade in the Denver Public Schools for 20 years. During this time she raised Scotties which she entered in dog shows and one became eligible to enter the Westminster Dog Show. For 30+ years, Kathleen taught piano and was a member of the Foothills Music Teachers Association where her students often won awards.

In 2004 she took an arts trip to St. Petersburg and Moscow with another DLOG member, Jan Austin Peck, where there were operas and ballets to be seen. 2005 took her to Paris where there were many visits to museums and travels to the French countryside. Attending DLOG's Opera on Tuesday luncheons and hearing today's opera singers has been a highlight of these past years. She last attended an OOT event at the Lakewood Country Club when she was 98. Kathleen, we wish you a very healthy future in which you get to hear new operas and continue to enjoy the ones from years' past.


