Denver Lyric Opera Guild

Denver Lyric Opera Guild is a non-profit membership organization. DLOG was founded in 1965 to help support the Denver Lyric Opera Company. The opera company was forced to close in 1968, but the Guild pursued other programs in keeping with its purpose to encourage and support young singers and provide continuing education to the members in the appreciation and knowledge of opera.

Competition for Colorado Singers

In 1984, the Guild inaugurated its signature event, the *Competition for Colorado Singers*, to support singers ages 23-32 in pursuing their operatic careers. Since then, the Guild has awarded over \$900,000 to Competition winners. Hundreds of young singers have successfully launched their operatic and musical careers since winning the Competition.

Grants

The Guild provides grants to Colorado's colleges and universities for vocal scholarships, and to apprentice opera programs. Over the years, these grants have totaled over \$850,000 from the earnings on our endowment. Grants are given to the voice performance programs at Colorado State University, Metro State University of Denver, University of Colorado, University of Denver, University of Northern Colorado, and young artist apprentice programs of Central City Opera, Opera Colorado, Opera Fort Collins, and Opera Theatre of the Rockies and Opera Steamboat. In 2021, universities and opera apprentice programs received grants totaling \$33,000.

The Louise C. Conter Master Class

Louise Conter (1924-1998) had a lifelong love of opera and the desire to help aspiring young singers. Upon her death in 1998, Denver Lyric Opera Guild became the recipient of an extraordinary bequest and her gift will ensure the support of young singers through the Guild's program for many years to come. DLOG is proud to salute Louise Conter at the annual DLOG Competition for Colorado Singers by naming the Master Class in her honor.

Louise was the only child of William and Catherine Conter. Her early years were spent in Brighton, Colorado. She graduated from Cathedral High School in Denver and later, embarked on a career in nursing. She trained and worked at Mercy Hospital in Denver before moving to the Colorado Springs Penrose Hospital. Louise returned to Denver in 1956 and worked as a surgical nurse at St. Anthony's Hospital for the next 25 years. She was a founding member of the Denver Association of Operating Nurses. She was a strong supporter of local musical organizations and a participating member of the Denver Lyric Opera Guild for many years. Upon retirement, Louise moved to the dairy farm in Commerce City owned by her grandparents where she lived until her death. Denver Lyric Opera Guild is a beneficiary of Louise Conter's kindness and generosity and we are forever grateful for her living gift!

Mardi Byers


American Soprano

American soprano, Mardi Byers is one of the most exciting and talented artists to have emerged from the United States of America in recent years. Hailed by the press as "The Grace Kelly of opera" (Die Welt), she is making her mark on international opera and concert stages including the Hamburg State Opera, the Bregenz

Festival, Moscow's Bolshoi Theater, New York City Opera, and the BBC Proms. Her triumphant opera debut as Floria Tosca at Theater Lübeck in 2003 earned her both critical and public acclaim, prompting invitations from leading opera houses to sing the major roles of her repertoire including Amelia Simon Boccanegra at the Hamburg State Opera, Aida at Finnish National Opera, Opera Toulon, as well as in Graham Vick's production for the Bregenz Festival, Donna Anna Don Giovanni for Opera Frankfurt and New York City Opera, Georgette and Suor Angelica II Trittico for New Orleans Opera, Elisabetta Don Carlo for Theater Basel directed by Calixto Beito, Marietta Die Tote Stadt, the title role of Tosca, Elizabeth Tannhäuser as well as Emilia Marty in Janàcek's opera Vec Makropulos (a Robert Carson production) at the Nürnber State Theater. In 2011, she was nominated for Russia's most prestigious theater award, "The Golden Mask" for her portrayal of Marie in the Dmitri Tcherniakov's celebrated production of Wozzeck conducted by Teodor Currentzis with the Bolshoi Theater. She also returned there as a guest in 2013, performing Der fliegende Holländer. She has performed 2 Richard Strauss roles (Chrysothemis Elektra and the title role in Ariadne auf Naxos) in Nürnberg and most recently covered the role of Salome at the Santa Fe Opera Festival. Mardi Byers' further European credits include Aida under the baton of Daniele Gatti, Elisabetta in Don Carlos in both the French and Italian versions, Amelia in I Masnadieri, Marguerite in Faust, the title role in Adriana Lecouvreur, La Contessa in Le nozze di Figaro, and Margarete in in Honegger's Jeanne d'Arc au Bûcher. Equally at home on the concert stage, Mardi Byers has performed Mahler's 8th Symphony at the First Night of the 2010 BBC Proms, Strauss' Vier letzte Lieder in Hamburg, the Verdi Requiem in Finnland's esteemed Turku Concert Hall, Beethoven's Ninth Symphony with the Stuttgart Symphony, and excerpts from Alban Berg's Wozzeck with the Düsseldorf Symphony Orchestra. Recitals have taken her to San Francisco, Zurich, Munich, Rome, and Salzburg. Mardi Byers is a native of Boulder, Colorado and currently makes her home in Zurich, Switzerland.



Dr. Jeremy Reger | International Performer and Educator

Jeremy Reger came to the University of Colorado after holding the position of director of keyboard studies and collaborative arts at Christopher Newport University in Virginia. The international performer and educator says although the natural beauty of the region was a big draw, in the end it was the passion of the students and faculty at the College of Music that led him here. "There's something special going on here," says Reger. "The exceptional, creative, inspiring community created between faculty and students is palpable, and it's very exciting to be a part of it."

Teaching and mentorship are Reger's true passions and he's worked with some of the top vocal performers and coaches in the country, including at the Minnesota Opera, Indiana Opera Theater, the Saint Paul Chamber Orchestra and the Ann Arbor Opera. In summer 2014 he was a coach and performer at the Opera Studio de Recife in Brazil. Reger has also been on the faculty of Music Academy of the West, and worked for Virginia Opera. A strong supporter of local arts organizations, he has also played with the Virginia Symphony, the Williamsburg Symphonia and the Cantabile Singers Art Song Project.

Dr. Reger holds degrees from Cincinnati Conservatory of Music and the University of Michigan.

JONATHAN HAYS



Jonathan Hays, a graduate of the Yale College of Music, has fully entered the ranks of the best young performers of his generation. Mr. Hays' repertoire includes leading roles in operas such as Don Giovanni (Don Giovanni, Masetto), Le Nozze di Figaro (Count, Figaro), Die Zauberflüte (Papageno), Cosi Fan Tutte (Guglielmo), Das Rheingold (Donner), La Boheme (Marcello, Schaunard), LíElisir díAmore (Belcore), Giulio Cesare (Achilla), Deidamia (Fenice), LíItaliana in Algeri (Taddeo), La Cenerentola (Dandani), La Gazza Ladra (Fernando), I Pagliacci (Silvio), Fidelio (Fernando), Albert Herring (Sid, Vicar), Béatrice et Bénédict (Somarone), which he has performed with such companies as The Washington Opera, Central City Opera, The Lyric Opera of Kansas City, The Caramoor Festival, Connecticut Opera, Connecticut Grand Opera and Orchestra, Opera de la Colombia, The Cape Town Opera, Syracuse Opera, Eugene Opera, The Oklahoma Mozart Festival, The Utah Festival Opera Company and Yale Opera. After an acclaimed performance of Rossini's La Gazza Ladra with the Caramoor Festival and the Orchestra of St. Lukes, Paul Griffiths of The New York Times wrote of his work, "...in all his contributions,

the nobility of his voice matched the nobility of his bearing and his singing was consistently strong, lucid, direct and bang on the note. His was a magnificent performance."

EAPEN LAUBNER



With impressive reviews from Opera News, the New York Times and Musical America, Eapen Leubner is one of classical music's most diverse artists. Eapen's roles range from Mozart to Donizetti to rarely performed opera (Mahler's Die Drei Pintos and Herbert's Sweethearts) and world-premiere American Opera. Eapen has performed from Alaska to New York to Tirana, Albania. He recently rejoined Boulder Opera for "The Firebringers", three short operas by Colorado composer Chappell Kingsland featuring the world premiere of "Iwa the Caiman." In May 2016, Eapen debuted with Opera Theatre of the Rockies in "The Mikado." A frequent performer in New York City, Eapen made his Carnegie Hall Solo debut with Mid-America Productions and his Brooklyn Academy of Music debut with Encompass New Opera Theatre. In 2015, Eapen founded the Denver Art Song Project to entertain and educate audiences new to the genre. The group presents lively art song performances incorporating storytelling, multimedia and more. Now incorporated as a 501c3, "Art Song Colorado", the group performs live across the state, produces albums on their non-profit label, and creates online videos. The group has partnered with Chamber Orchestra of the Springs, Denver Arts & Venues, St. Andrews UMC and other organizations to introduce new audiences to the passion and power of classical singing. 
