

The Sketch Behind the Scenery



When the ever-creative Jeremy Reger suggested **The Silver Circuit** program for the Summer Party, we were taken back to the early years when 'culture' was just beginning to appear in towns generally better known for their saloons and dance halls.

Each early Colorado opera house has a unique story to tell but one thing they had in common during the late Victorian era was scenery hand painted by traveling artists. Many of you may have read about the discovery in 2020 of rare hand painted scenery in the attic of the Leadville Tabor Opera House where it had been stored and overlooked for 100 years. The discovery received national attention and is a true Colorado treasure. Much of it was painted by a well-known artist of the era, T. Frank Cox. As good fortune would have it, there

were many little surprises slipped into unexpected places by the good-humored and slightly mischievous Frank Cox. The photo left is a pencil sketch of himself from the late 1800s penciled onto the back of a piece of his scenery. What a delight to see the artist himself with his paints and brushes off to work on another production. Creede Musical Arts Collective Inaugural Concert Series

Colorado has a new music festival and it has opera! Many DLOG members may remember Competition singer and past DLOG member Megan Marino. Megan (pictured left), along with her baritone husband Michael Mayes have founded the Creede Musical Arts Collective in the old mining town of Creede. The first of the inaugural concert series was held the weekend of August 12-14 in the stunning mountain town. If you missed the first concerts, fear not, as the second round will be going on Labor Day weekend Sept 2-4, with plans to make this an annual concert series.

Megan and Michael bring incredible talent to these concerts not only of themselves, but also of the professionals and friends they attract. The first concert night in the acoustically gorgeous Creede Sunnyside Chapel featured soprano <u>Alexandra Lobianco</u> as well as Megan. Also performing on marimba was <u>Gregory Zuber</u>, the Principal Percussionist for the MET Orchestra, his partner and flutist <u>Patricia Wolf Zuber</u>, and your friend and mine on piano <u>Jeromy Reger</u> (he is indeed everywhere). Arias performed included Puccini's "Vissi d'arte" and "Un bel di vedremo". Debussy pieces were performed on marimba and flute with Mr. Reger accompanying and soloing on piano.







As most singers and performers had just come from Santa Fe Opera (7000ft) and were "taking a break" to sing in Creede (8800ft), a situation straight from an opera played out on day two. Unfortunately, the main soprano could not continue and required vocal rest. This put Megan, who had not been planning on it, in the position of covering the bulk of the vocal work. But wouldn't you know, a young singer was in the audience. Nisha Caiozzi, DLOG member, this author's daughter, and 4th year vocal undergrad at Oberlin, stepped forward and volunteered pieces she'd been working on. As is often remarked..."showing up is 80 percent of life" and to utter amazement, they put the rookie in. Although this was a festival in Creede and not opening night at La Scala, the tension and uncertainty were palpable. To continue the evening, Nisha and Megan performed a duet of "Barcarolle" ("Belle nuit") from *Les contes d'Hoffmann* to much applause and the show went on. The third and final day involved an outdoor concert in the park with singers Megan, Nisha, Emily Murdock, and Michelle Richardson with accompaniment by the Zubers, Jeromy Reger, and accordionist Debbie Whitmore. Of note to DLOG members, Emily is the current Central City Education and Community Programs Director and Podcast Host. Like Megan, she was a multi-year <u>DLOG Competition Finalist</u> (2015, 2012). Colorado is truly blessed to have this new music showcase.


