

UPDATE: DLOG 2023 Competition for Colorado Singers



Aspiring opera singers face extraordinary challenges in the pursuit of a career in opera. As in any profession, talent and hard work are top requirements for success. However, unlike many other professions, talent and hard work are not enough. Young opera singers face unprecedented financial challenges. To succeed they must continue vocal training, acting lessons, and language lessons. They must pay for student loans, audition fees, transportation to and from auditions and lodging while there, head shots, proper audition and competition apparel, and more. It is estimated that a young opera singer will pay well over \$10,000 annually in out-of-pocket career related expenses. As a result, many young singers do not achieve their goal of a career in opera not for a lack of talent but a lack of funds.

The Denver Lyric Opera Guild was formed to help relieve some of the financial burden talented young Colorado singers face, allowing them to focus on their artistic development and career goals. Each spring the Denver Lyric Opera Guild holds the Competition for Colorado Singers. This competition is for Colorado opera singers ages 23 to 32. In 2023 DLOG awarded \$38,000 in total prize money for the Competition including a \$10,000 first place award. Since its inception DLOG has awarded almost \$1,000,000 in Competition prize money. Due in part to the support of the Denver Lyric Opera Guild, over the years many young Colorado singers have launched successful careers in opera. See information below on two of our past winners. Matthew Plenk (facilitator) - Artistic Director of Lamont Opera Theatre at The University of Denver's Lamont School of Music where he is also appointed as Assistant Professor of Voice. Catching Up With Past DLOG Competition Winners





CYNTHIA LAWRENCE - 1989 DLOG Competition Winner

Cynthia Lawrence is acclaimed as one of America's most exciting "singing actresses" and sings at the leading opera companies around the world; the Metropolitan Opera (Roxanne in Cyrano de Bergerac, Dolly in Sly, Tosca, Cio-Cio-San in Madama Butterfly, and Rosalinda in Die Fledermaus); The Washington National Opera (**Elettra** in *Idomeneo*); Portland Opera (**Tosca**); Lyric Opera of Chicago (Candace in A Wedding, Lavinia in Mourning Becomes Electra, Elettra in Idomeneo, Countess Olga in Fedora, The Italian Singer in Strauss's Capriccio, Musetta in La Boheme, Vitellia in La Clemenza di Tito, Micaela in Carmen, The First Lady, in Die Zauberflöte, Rosalinda, Fiordiligi in Cosi fan Tutte, and Lisa in Sonnambula); Opera Carolina (Tosca, Cio-Cio-San); Deutsche Staatsoper Berlin, New Israeli Opera, Opera Pacific, and Opera Colorado (Lady Macbeth in Verdi's Macbeth); Deutsche Staatsoper Berlin (Die Frau in Schoenberg's Von Heute auf Morgen); Lake George Opera Festival (Cio-Cio-San); Royal Opera House, Covent Garden (Musetta); Paris Opera, Prague's National Theater (Vitellia in La Clemenza di Tito); Grand Theatre de Geneva, Opera Columbus, Vlaamse Opera, Dayton Opera (Rosalinda); Minnesota Opera (Countess in Le nozze di Figaro); Opera Ontario (Cio-Cio-San); Athens Festival, Theater Megaron (Elettra); New York City Opera (Rosalinda, Cio-Cio-San, Musetta); Opera Omaha (Micaela, Liu); Central City Opera (Marguerite, Micaela, Mimi); Castleward Opera, Belfast, Ireland (Fiordiligi); and Colorado Opera Festival, Opera Memphis, Opera Enschede Holland, and Santander Festival (Donna Anna in Don Giovanni).

She has appeared over 70 times in concert with Luciano Pavarotti; touring cities and countries such as Doha, Qatar; Italy; Chile; Venezuela, Argentina; Germany; Norway; Japan; China; Malaysia; England; Canada; South Africa and throughout the United States. She has also appeared with him in two televised broadcasts on PBS: "Live from Lincoln Center" concert "Pavarotti Plus!", a live concert from Miami Beach, and on a PBS special "Pavarotti: My World." She is also a member of the original "Three Sopranos". Other concert appearances include Alban Berg's rarely performed Der Wein with the Grand Theatre Geneve; a Solo Recital with the Orchestre de la Suisse Romand; Strauss' Vier Letzte Lieder and a recital of Mozart concert arias for the Colorado Music Festival; a tour of Mozart Concert aria with Rudolf Buchbinder throughout Italy; performances of Verdi's Requiem in Utah; the Mozart Requiem at the Hollywood Bowl with Ivan Fisher; performances with the Columbus Symphony in Rossini's Stabat Mater; and Berg's Sieben Frühe Lieder in Colorado.

Her many awards include First Place in the Concorso Di Canto Di Mozart, Vienna, Venice, Paris, Rome; being a Metropolitan Opera National Winner, winning The Birgit Nilsson Prize, the Metropolitan Opera Rocky Mountain Region, the Denver Lyric Opera Guild, the Society of Arts and Letters, Allied Arts, the MacAllister Awards, the Stewart Awards and the Pavarotti International competitions.

QUINN PATRICK ANKRUM - 1999 DLOG Competition Award Winner

An active performer, Mezzo soprano Quinn Patrick Ankrum has sung a wide variety of repertoire spanning the centuries, in a multitude of venues throughout the United States and abroad. Favorite roles include Rosina (Il barbiere di Siviglia), Cenerentola (La Cenerentola), Zerlina (Le nozze di Figaro), Meg (Adamo's Little Women), and Maddalena (Rigoletto). She created the role of the Mother in Jefferson Todd Frazier's groundbreaking new opera Breath of Life. Equally at home on the concert stage, favorite works include Bach's Mass in b minor, Mozart's Mass in c minor, Mahler's Lieder eines fahrenden Gesellen. and Handel's Messiah. Recent seasons have included Messiah with the Lubbock Symphony Orchestra; Luciano Berio's Folksongs, William Walton's Facade, Steve Danyew's Alcott Songs, and Mahler's Lieder eines fahrenden Gesellen with ensembles at the University of Cincinnati, College-Conservatory of Music; recitals in Ohio, Oklahoma, and New York (Fredonia); solo appearances the Cincinnati Fusion Ensemble, and programs of works from the Oratorio and American song repertoire in the Lorn Live Chamber Music Festival (Oban, Scotland), and in the inaugural Sing Northumbria Festival in Northern England.

Ankrum received her training at Trinity University (San Antonio), the University of Colorado at Boulder, and the Eastman School of Music, and was a Young Artist in the Glimmerglass Opera Young American Artists Program and the Baltimore Opera Studio. She was a Finalist and Winner in numerous regional and national competitions, including the Metropolitan Opera National Council auditions (Rocky Mountain Region) and the National Association of Teachers of Singing Artist Awards (NATSAA) competition. She has served on the faculties of SUNY Fredonia (NY), Nazareth College (Rochester, NY), and Texas Tech University (Lubbock). She joined the faculty of the University of Cincinnati, College-Conservatory of Music in 2017 and currently serves as Associate Professor of Voice.


