As I was preparing these notes to you, I found some quotes that I had posted in my voice studio at the University of Colorado, Boulder and I wish to share parts of them with you.

These quotes are about performing and/or singing:

Agnes de Mille was an American dancer and choreographer whose credits included choreographing **Oklahoma**, **Carousel**, **Brigadoon**, **Paint your Wagon** as well as Copland's ballet, **Rodeo** stated:

"Great theatre figures of various categories differ widely, but they have this in common: They do not tire, they do not flinch, they never give up and they never become discouraged, or if they do, like Martha Graham, they never tell."

Glen Griffin, the music critic for the Denver Post in the 1970s - 80s had this to say about being a professional:

"Programming oneself to be a professional just doesn't have a textbook approach........ At every opening of the curtain the professional's reputation is at stake. Always. Every night. No exceptions, knowing this, the pro gives as much as he is capable; Amateurs make excuses."

These quotes give some ideas about the training and mental attitude the singer/performer must acquire in their training to become a professional.

Denver Lyric Opera Guild is promoting the growth and education of these young singers who are participating in the **Vocal Competition**, teaching them the habits and tools for making the leap into the professional world. Few will make it as full time professional singers/performers, but all will learn valuable lessons in the competition that will shape their lives and careers, no matter which career path they follow.

You as members of **DLOG** are supporting a wonderful, exciting education journey these young singers are about to experience. We wish all of them success, brilliant performances and as the old saying goes: May the best singer win and may everyone gain immeasurable experience to help them in their life's journey.

The Denver Lyric Opera Guild's annual Summer Party, "Vive La France", has revealed its date! August 12, 2023 at noon will see throngs arrive for the exciting French-themed event! Woven into a luncheon of French cuisine and special French wine opportunities will be a performance by Colorado tenor Mark Van Arsdale, accompanied by Dr. Jeremy Reger of the University of Colorado. Columbine Country Club will be our host.

Early in life, Mark Van Arsdale, began entertaining others by singing. He amazed and delighted his big sister's slumber party by performing a complete rendition of "It's My Party" by Leslie Gore at age $2\frac{1}{2}$. Mark's mother, Kathy, volunteered for Opera Colorado by leading Student Backstage Tours. When childcare fell through, she brought Mark, age 4, along. The brief student performance featured a scene from Gounod's Faust. Spellbound as Faust--in a midnight-blue velvet cape with red eyes—slowly rose to the stage from beneath the floor, singing beautifully, he whispered to his mother: "That's what I want to do when I grow up!" He never wavered in his commitment to achieve that goal. When fellow Kindergarteners drew fire fighters or policemen to illustrate their adult jobs, Mark drew Pagliacci with a tall clown hat, singing through his tears.

Selected for starring roles in various school musical productions from Grade 3 on, he brought the Troll to life in "Three Billy Goats Gruff". This prompted his music teachers and several audience members to predict a professional future for young Mark. The number 1 Tenor I as a Junior and Senior during adjudication for Colorado All-State Choir, he also was chosen as one of 12 Colorado All State Choir participants both years. Starring in Cherry Creek High School musicals all 4 years, he had

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to decline the honor his senior year in order to participate in the National HS Grammy Jazz Choir, one of 12 singers chosen nation-wide. There, he was picked as the soloist to serenade Grammy award nominees on the Red Carpet as they arrived for the award ceremony. Clearly fascinated by all kinds of music, we will hear Mark and Jeremy perform several genres on Saturday, August 12 at our Summer Party luncheon!

Louise Barish 1923-2023

Louise Barish passed away peacefully on January 27, 2023. She was 99 years old. She had an incredible life loving the arts -- opera, ballet, symphony, etc.

She was a surgical nurse for over 60 years and received the Florence Nightingale Award.

She was a member of DLOG for many many years. Because of health issues she dropped out for a couple of years but then came back and enjoyed going to the competition events and to luncheons.

Her greatest achievement was to convince her best friend Louise Conter to leave a great majority of her estate (about 1.2 million dollars) to DLOG instead of to a religious organization. It is because of Louise that DLOG has a very large endowment fund.

She requested that donations in her memory be made either to DLOG or to the Colorado Symphony.




Bach Competition for Young Artists

Saturday May 20, 7pm, St. Andrew Methodist Church, Highlands Ranch

For our final event of the year, we are excited to host a Bach Competition for aspiring vocal soloists from around the world interested in the music of J. S. Bach. Following a preliminary round of recorded solo submissions, eight highly qualified finalists will be selected to travel to Colorado and participate in our in-person final round, which will make up the final concert of the season. This concert will feature Bach's well-known cantata 147, Herz und Mund und Tat und Leben (Heart and Mouth and Deed and Life), highlighting one of the most famous chorale melodies, Jesu, Joy of Man's Desiring. The soloists will also perform several of Bach's beloved arias from his other cantatas and large works. One First Prize Winner and one Runner-Up will be selected at the conclusion of the concert. They will receive cash prizes, and each will have an opportunity to perform with CBE in future seasons at the discretion of the Artistic Director.
