Vive la France! Vive la Fête! Our exciting French-themed Summer Party will be a lively luncheon at noon August 12! Be prepared to participate!

Plan ahead!

1. To participate in our Wine Pull Fundraiser, please purchase a bottle (or several) of wine (consider French, but any kind is OK). This is your donation to the DLOG Wine Pull Fundraiser. Bring your wine to our May 2 Opera on Tuesday and Annual Meeting. Give it to Lynn Harrington, who will prepare it for the Summer Party event by giving each bottle a number. At the party, you may purchase any number of bottles of wine that you wish at \$20 each, receiving a number. As you leave the party, the committee will match your number(s) to mystery bottle(s) of wine donated by your DLOG wine connoisseur friends. Take these home to enjoy and relive your fun Summer Party experience! If you forget to bring your donation to the May meeting, you'll have to drive it to Kathy Van Arsdale's (or Lynn's) house for the event. Avoid that, and BRING WINE to the meeting!

2. Tickets for the Summer Party will go on sale on our website in mid-June. Invite friends, and consider buying these early, since there is a possibility that the event will sell out. You may suggest 3 people that you'd like to be at your table—the committee will assign the rest, hoping that you and guests will get to know new people. They will want to join DLOG to get to know you better!

3. Plan to arrive promptly, NOT early, since the doors will be unlocked at noon, and all seating is assigned by table number. You may relax in the main public areas of the Country Club or chat outside until the doors open for the event.

4. Watch for attire in colors of the French flag: blue, white, red—to go on sale so you can wear it to the party! Ooh La La!!

Entertainment for the Summer Party will be provided by Colorado tenor <u>Mark Van Arsdale</u>, accompanied by Dr. Jeremy Reger of the University of Colorado. Mark trained in Colorado until leaving for college. The Colorado Children's Chorale provided seven years of rigorous learning and a variety of professional experiences. His teachers included Mary Louise Burke, Deborah DeSantis, and Maestro Duain Wolfe. A member of the children's chorus for Opera Colorado's *Tosca* and *La Boehme*, he gained valuable stage experience. He was chosen by Mr. Wolfe as soloist for Benjamin Britten's *Ceremony of Carols*, and for Children's Chorale tour performances in Japan. An invaluable inspiration, coach, critic, and mentor of the highest standards, Mr. Wolfe, who recently retired as conductor of the Chicago Symphony Chorus, chose Mark to sing with Central City Opera Company the part of "Second Lady" in the *Magic Flute*. Mozart wrote this music to be sung by children. Mark was later chosen to sing his first Tamino at the University of Indiana's *Magic Flute* and has sung that role more than any other as a professional. He continues to sing a lot of Mozart. President Elect Kathy Van Arsdale and Peter will visit France to see Mark sing Tamino in Reims (Champagne Region) in May. Throughout HS, Mark performed as a Supernumerary for Opera Colorado, learning more operas.

Fortunate enough to attend the only Grammy Award winning High School music program in the state at Cherry Creek HS, Mark

continued as a soloist, touring soloist, and the lead in musicals. He earned side money as a Dickens Caroler. He attended Yellowstone and Wisconsin Vocal Jazz Camps, earned a Tanglewood Music Festival Internship, and studied voice with Ken Cox of the University of Denver. He chose a full undergraduate experience rather than a conservatory, enjoying Northwestern University. He loved his acapella experience performing with, then directing Freshman Fifteen, a famed student group. He performed as soloist for the Monteverdi Vespers of 1612, Handel's *Solomon*, Verdi's *Falstaff*, and Don Ottavio in Mozart's *Don Giovanni*.

At Indiana University, Mark studied with Robert Harrison, who recently facilitated our Competition for Colorado Singers Master Class. He starred as Trufaldino in Prokofiev's *Love for Three Oranges*, Ferrando in Mozart's *Cosi fan Tutte*, and as Tamino in an elaborate production of *The Magic Flute* that was broadcast. Returning to Tanglewood, he was selected by James Levine to sing Don Ottavio in Mozart's *Don Giovanni*, performing the role three times under his baton. Mark was a winner in the DLOG Competition for Colorado Singers, and a Central City Opera Apprentice. Professional performances as soloist in Handel's *Messiah* followed, in Chicago and Cheyenne. Using DLOG prize money, he auditioned at L'Opéra National du Rhin in Strasbourg, France, where he won an apprenticeship. He won leads in Donizetti's *L'Exir d'Amore*, and Gounod's *Romeo and Juliet*. With an agent in Germany and two in Paris, his professional career has been primarily in France. Mark has also sung in Ecuador, Morocco, Italy, Germany, Austria, and Switzerland, and speaks 4 languages. He owns an apartment in charming Colmar, Alsace, on the Route du Vin in France, which he rents on Airbnb when he is not staying there. Alsatian whites will be among the featured French wines available by the glass at our Summer Party luncheon August 12.

# CHRISTIAN MARK GIBBS – An All-Around Success!



Remembered by DLOG members not just for his wonderful voice but also for his outsized personality and infectious smile, Guyanese-American tenor and New York City native, Christian Mark Gibbs, is quickly establishing himself as a versatile artist in various mediums of artistry including opera, musical theatre, TV/Film, and commercial work.

Christian is currently an ensemble member in the Lincoln Center revival of Lerner and Loewe's "Camelot". CMG's 2021-22 season included a series of debuts and worldpremieres at leading houses and performance venues. A highlight of this season included CMG as guest artist at **The Kennedy Center**, as part of their 50th Anniversary season. As a guest artist, CMG makes his **Washington National Opera** house debut starring in two world premiere operas (*it all falls down* by Carlos Simon and *The Rift* by Huang Ruo) in the monument driven program, *Written in Stone*. In September 2021, CMG made his international solo debut starring as Tony in *West Side Story* in Finland at the **Savoy-teatteri**. Also in the 2021-2022 season, CMG made his **Lincoln Center Theater** debut in the cast of Ricky Ian Gordon and Lynn Nottage's new hit opera *Intimate Apparel*, directed by Bartlett Sher. CMG closed out the season by returning to **The Metropolitan Opera** in the US premiere of Brett Dean's *Hamlet*.



An avid champion of versatility as an artist, CMG was most recently seen in a national ad for **Tillamook**, as the official Cheddar MC for their Cheddarbration campaign for National Cheddar Day, which coincided with the SuperBowl. More ad clientele includes Good Morning America/ABC, Cohen's Fashion Optical, Sotheby's International Realty, AXON, and NICE. As a TV actor, CMG was also recently cast as Cuba Gooding Sr. on the hit show WUTANG: An American Saga on **HULU** and Dennis on My True Crime Story on **VH1**.

Concert engagements include CMG as a soloist at venues Feinstein's 54/below, Joe's Pub, Lincoln Center, Carnegie Hall, and tenor soloist in concert works at Queens College and Yale University.

Christian Mark Gibbs made his Metropolitan Opera debut as Robbins and Crab Man in the GRAMMY award winning production of *Porgy and Bess* in February 2020. In May of 2021, CMG made his **Opera Theatre of St. Louis** debut in the critically acclaimed production of *Highway 1 U.S.A.* alongside Nicole Cabell and Will Liverman. CMG received the 2021 Richard Gaddes Career Award for his portrayal of Nate.



In addition to his international debut in Finland, in December 2021 CMG released an EP of two songs ("Maria" & "Something's Coming") that were recorded live from the *West Side Story* production at the Savoy-teatteri with the Vantaan Viihdeorkesteri. This EP is titled *TONY: Two Songs from West Side Story* (*LIVE*) and is available on all major streaming platforms including iTunes, Apple Music, Spotify and more!

Christian's other notable credits include Oklahoma at **Denver Center**, Falstaff at **Opera Colorado**, The Love I Meant to Say at Lucille Lortel Theater, and Coalhouse Walker Jr. in the Ragtime Fan Film: Wheels of A Dream directed by Akil DuPont.

CMG has both a MM (Colorado State University) and BM (Aaron Copland School of Music - Queens College) in Vocal Performance.

Talk about being able to do it all! Christian has taken his talent, his enthusiasm and his extraordinary zest for life and built himself a truly amazing career! Can't wait to see what comes next!!!

# The Little Prince



The University of Denver Lamont School of Music recently presented the opera *The Little Prince* by Rachel Portman at the Newman Center for the Performing Arts, Gates Concert Hall. The Thursday evening production was a sweet and whimsical, featuring a standout performance by tenor Liam Dooley as the Pilot. DLOG members may remember Liam from our November Opera on Tuesday. Rachel Regalado beautifully captured the innocence and childlike exuberance of the Little Prince. The cast also included DLOG Competition participants Oliver Poveda-Zavala and Megan Pryor.

Based on the beloved 1943 book by Antoine de Saint-Exupéry, *The Little Prince* is the story of a stranded pilot meeting a young prince who has fallen to Earth from a tiny asteroid. As the Little Prince explores the Earth, he meets a number of colorful, and often puzzling, characters.

The opera was first performed at the Houston Grand Opera in May 2003; these performances at Lamont will be the first in Colorado. It is also the first time that the Lamont School of Music has presented an opera by a living, female composer. Matthew Plenk was the artistic director and stage director and Sahar Nouri was the music director and conductor. The scenery and costumes that so beautifully captured the spirit of the beloved children's book, were designed by Jacob A. Climer and produced and provided by the Utah Symphony and Utah Opera.

With a libretto by Nicholas Wright, The Little Prince defines and celebrates friendship, love, and truth.

This piece addresses the history of gray wolves in Colorado and their relationship with people and domesticated animals. In 2020, Colorado voters passed a controversial proposition to reintroduce wolves to the

state, raising questions about its potential impact on regional ecology and livestock. Our story, oriented toward family audiences, follows two reintroduced wolves, Luna (the mother, soprano) and Sky (young male cub, mezzo-soprano). Sky struggles to adjust to living in Colorado but eventually learns to adapt to her new world. With a premiere scheduled for summer 2023 through Art Song Colorado, this workshop will allow us time to develop the piece before presenting a more polished version to larger audiences.
