Measure for Measure

We have noticed the darkness covering our world since the Daylight Savings time switch. We have noticed dark world issues surrounding us: war, genocide, famine, mass shootings. As we approach the Winter Solstice, much about our world appears dark. Romans, Druids, Pagans and others enjoyed holidays involving light during the darkest days of winter. Christians, Hindus and Jews observe holidays that involve light during this time. Diwali is a major Hindu holiday celebrating light over darkness as symbolized with special clay lamps lit for the celebration. These remind all that inner light overcomes spiritual darkness. The Jewish Festival of Lights, Hanukkah, celebrates the rededication of the 2nd Temple in Jerusalem. The lamp with oil for 1 day burned for 8 days:

"A great miracle happened there". For Christians, Christmas is a major holiday near the Winter Solstice (we don't know exactly when Jesus was born...). It still contains pagan symbols as part of traditional celebrations: wreaths on the door, Christmas trees, the Yule Log, and mistletoe! Our family gathers each Christmas Eve in candlelight to hear four stories read by the grandparents, aunts and uncles: Luke 2, Eugene Fields' Jest 'Fore Christmas, (Did you know he was from Denver? Do you know where his library is? Can you employ the proper accent and demeanor in reading this portrayal of a 10-year-old boy?), Virginia O'Hanlon's letter to the editor of the Chicago Sun (a fantastic essay on why belief in Santa Claus is vital), and Clement Moore's 'Twas the Night Before Christmas while we smell Norwegian Julekake rising. What are your special traditions?

For many, the "Christmas Blues" are real. Reminders of grief, suffering, loss, pain, abuse, loneliness and other difficulties that occurred during this season can deeply affect some. Being surrounded by joyous celebrants can be very painful. As the granddaughter, daughter, and sister of recovered alcoholics, I can understand why our church offers a Blue Christmas service to support those who suffer during the holidays. Some people are affected to varying degrees by Seasonal Affective Disorder in which victims suffer depressive symptoms which appear in the months of less sunlight. My friend who suffers from SAD relaxes by the light of special lamps, listening to music. Music is associated with each of the holidays mentioned above; special Diwali classical dance music, the mighty hymn "Maoz Tzur" of Hanukkah, dozens of Christmas Carols. Many memorable classical works are related to Christmas: J. S. Bach's Christmas Oratorio, Britten's Ceremony of Carols, Menotti's Amahl and the Night Visitors, Anderson's Sleigh Ride. Two of the most popular Christmas performances in the United States are Handel's Messiah and Tchaikovsky's Nutcracker. In other parts of the world, these works are performed any time of year. This year, why not invite music into your holiday realm? Choirs, orchestras, ballet troupes—all have been rehearsing for you! The magic of live performance can do wonders for the soul! Share a performance with loved ones to brighten their lives, too. Remember with pleasant nostalgia, holidays past: I can clearly recall one Christmas Eve standing in the pew next to me (at age 21) my 82year-old grandmother's quavering tone-right on pitch-her face full of radiant joy singing her favorite carol: There's a Song In the Air! The melodic line of this carol with arpeggios and great leaps is probably too difficult to make it a big hit, sadly—it's gorgeous! Listen to Christmas Carol texts: "And the star spreads its light as the beautiful sing", or "Yet in thy dark streets shineth the everlasting light" (O Little *Town of Bethlehem*—now in the Israeli West Bank), and more with the light over darkness themes.

Come, All Ye Faithful! "The people who walk in darkness will see a great light!" (Isiah 9, quoted in *Messiah*). Face the darkness with renewed determination to overcome the darkness with light! Let music lead the way! Enjoy this very MUSICAL SEASON!

Why not start with a visit to our DLOG Opera on Tuesday this December 5 with students from the University of Colorado? Hoping to see you there!

Traditionally our support has come through grants to area colleges and universities and opera company young artist programs, and through prize monies awarded through our annual Competition for Colorado Singers. This year we are expanding our reach by providing a day for aspiring young Colorado opera singers to have access to a professionally done headshot at a greatly reduced price. As an organization, we understand that pursuing a career in opera comes with many financial challenges. While a professionally done headshot is a must for applications and websites, it can be a strain on a young artist's budget. This is where Denver Lyric Opera Guild comes in.

For a signup fee of just \$20, we are offering up to 25 young area opera singers the opportunity to receive a headshot taken by Jamie Kraus. Ms. Kraus is one of Colorado's leading headshot and arts photographers. Each singer will get one 15-minute studio session, with one outfit. Sessions come with one fully retouched photo included, with the option for the singer to purchase more at the session.



Amahl and the Night Visitors Dec 23, 24, Central Presbyterian Church, Denver



Amahl and the Night Visitors is a family-friendly opera and has been enduringly popular since its premier in 1951. Commissioned by NBC as the first opera written for television, *Amahl and the Night Visitors* debuted on December 24, 1951 becoming the first network television Christmas special to become an annual tradition. Composer Gian Carlo Menotti drew inspiration for the opera from Hieronymus Bosch's The Adoration of the Magi, which hangs in the Metropolitan

Museum of Art, and from his childhood in Italy where gifts were brought at Christmas by the Three Kings instead of Santa Claus.
