Mark your calendar for a very special Master Class featuring 2011 DLOG Competition Winner tenor John Lindsey as facilitator.

Now Assistant Professor of Music at Colorado State University, American tenor John Lindsey, who has been noted for his "clarion tone" and "blazing tenor" by *Opera News*, has gained a reputation as a budding dramatic tenor with a connection to German, English and new works repertoire.

In the 2019-2020 season, Mr. Lindsey will return to Pacific Opera Victoria to make his role debut as Bill in *Flight* by Jonathan Dove. He will also make house debuts at Opéra de Montréal as Monostatos in *Die Zauberflöte* and at Opera on the Avalon as Edward in *Ours* by John Estacio.

In the 2018-2019 season, Mr. Lindsey appeared in Madison Opera's annual Opera in the Parks concert, in anticipation of a role and company debut as the Prince in *Rusalka*, and returned to Austin Opera for a reprisal of Jonathan Dale in *Silent Night*, a role he originated for the world premiere at Minnesota Opera. In the 2017/2018 season, John Lindsey made his Canadian debut with Pacific Opera Victoria as Steva in *Jenufa*, followed by a role debut as Froh in *Das Rheingold* with Arizona Opera. Other notable roles include Narraboth in *Salome*, Nick/cover for Dick Johnson in *La Fanciulla del West*, and Don Jose in *Carmen*.

Mr. Lindsey was an apprentice artist with Des Moines Metro Opera in 2015, a resident artist with Minnesota Opera from 2011-2014, and a studio artist with Central City Opera in 2011. He received his Master of Music in Voice Performance from the University of Colorado at Boulder, and his Bachelor of Music in Voice

Performance from Colorado State University in his hometown of Fort Collins. In 2015, he was invited to participate in the International Competition for Wagnerian Voices at Bayreuth.

This is a wonderful opportunity for DLOG members to learn more about what it takes to develop an operatic voice from both a technical and artistic standpoint. If you haven't yet attended one of our Master Classes, we highly recommend you give it a try. They are very informative and lots of fun!

As an organization, Denver Lyric Opera Guild holds as one of its primary missions the financial support for young Colorado opera singers. Traditionally our support has come through grants to area colleges and universities and opera company young artist programs, and through prize monies awarded through our annual Competition for Colorado Singers. This year we expanded our reach by providing a day for aspiring young Colorado opera singers to have access to a professionally done headshot at a greatly reduced price. As an organization, we understand that pursuing a career in opera comes with many financial challenges. While a professionally done headshot is a must for applications and websites, with a price tag for an individual photoshoot of almost \$400.00 it can be a strain on a young artist's budget. This is where Denver Lyric Opera Guild came in.

On December 3rd, DLOG hosted our first ever Headshot Day where we offered young area opera singers the opportunity to receive a headshot taken by Jamie Kraus for a registration fee of just \$20.00. Ms. Kraus is one of Colorado's leading headshot and arts photographers. Each singer got one 15-minute studio session, with one outfit. Sessions came with one fully retouched photo included, with the option for the singer to purchase more at the session for just \$50.00 each.



We had twenty singers participate in the event. The age range of participating singers was 19 to 35. Some of our participants were getting their first headshots ever. Others were updating old ones. For some singers this was their first exposure to DLOG while others were old friends.

For all involved it was a magical day. Gayle and Gary Landis generously donated the use of their home for the event, and it couldn't have worked out better. With the welcoming environment and top-notch



and engaged. The only minor hitch was that Jamie took so many wonderful photos of each singer that making choices took a bit longer than anticipated. Singers helped each other select their best looks making it much more fun than a traditional photo shoot. People who usually hated their pictures ended up with multiple photos that they absolutely loved.

Xochitl and the Flower

an opera is, the plot of Xochitl and the Flowers, and engage the audience in an art activity where they create tissue paper flowers and cut outs that will serve as props for the opera performance. After this craft, the audience will watch the beautiful performance of Xochitl and the Flowers. This opera has a run-time of 45 minutes, and is the perfect introduction to opera for anyone of any age. We recommend guests 3 years and older!

Xochitl and the Flowers (pronounced "soh-chee") is a bilingual opera sung in both English and Spanish by Santa Cruz based composer Chris Pratorium Gómez. Based on real-life events in San Francisco's Mission neighborhood, this quintessentially American immigration story tells the moving tale of a family's determination to put down roots in a new country, while still preserving the heritage of their homeland. The opera is based on Jorge Argueta's children's book Xochitl and the Flowers. The music is influenced by Latin American styles and will include traditional percussion instruments and rhythms.


Laffont Met Opera Competion - Rocky Mountain Region
