First and foremost, I would like to thank the members of the Denver Lyric Opera Guild for trusting me with the stewardship of the Guild for the coming year. I am honored to serve as Guild president and will do my best to ensure that we continue to build on our mission to support young Colorado singers in their pursuit of a career in opera. As part of my responsibilities as president, I am asked to write a piece for each of our newsletters. Unfortunately, I am not nearly as eloquent as our outgoing president, Kathy VanArsdale, who's pieces each month were so inspirational and so beautifully written. Instead of trying to duplicate Kathy's wonderful articles, today I will speak about my own DLOG journey.

I was first introduced to the Denver Lyric Opera Guild over 15 years ago. My mother had recently moved to Denver from Tennessee. One of her new neighbors, Mary Bahde, asked my mother to accompany her to a DLOG Opera on Tuesday. Like many of our members, this was her entry into the Guild. After attending one of the Competitions, my mother asked me to join her at the Competition the following year as she knew of my love for music. I went and was

astonished by the depth of talent. I became a member soon after. The next year my mother was asked to serve

as Candidate Check-In Chair for the Competition, and she enlisted my help in the green room. As I was still working full time the Competition, which fell on a weekend, was one of the few opportunities I had to experience what DLOG had to offer.

Working backstage with the singers, getting to know them, and hearing about the many challenges faced by up and coming opera singers was a real revelation for me. So many things that now seem obvious were things I had never before considered. How do these singers learn and continue their growth in the craft? How do they learn the needed languages? How do they perfect their acting skills? How do they navigate the audition process? How do they afford the needed gowns, tuxes, suits, photos, etc.? I had never before given much thought to these things, but in talking to the singers I came to appreciate the mission of the Guild in a way that I never had in the past. Looking back at my own College days and the years immediately following, I could not imagine having to layer all of these additional expenses on top of just the cost of living. My appreciation for the dedication and sacrifice required of these singers has only grown over the years. The fact that DLOG has been instrumental in helping so many young singers overcome these hurdles and advance in their careers is a source of great pride to me and should be to you as well.

As a bonus, my work on the Denver Lyric Opera Board, Opera on Tuesdays and, more recently, the Liverpool card group, has gifted me with a wonderful group of friends.

What more could you possibly ask of an organization than the opportunity to help literally hundreds of young Colorado singers, expand your network of friends, and the chance to listen to such glorious music all at the same time? I am truly honored to be a part of such a remarkable organization.



Cynthia was the winner of our 1989 Competition for Colorado Singers and has been a proud supporter of the Guild and its work ever since. In fact, she recently enrolled as a DLOG member!

A principal artist at The Metropolitan Opera; Washington National Opera; Guangzhou Opera House; Royal Albert Hall, London; Lyric Opera of Chicago; Vancouver Opera; Deutsche Staatsoper, Berlin; New Israeli Opera; Opera Pacific; Atlanta Opera; Portland Opera; Opera Colorado; Lithuanian National Opera; Royal Opera House, Covent Garden; Paris Opera, Prague's National Theater; Palacio Das Artes, in Belo Horizonte, Brazil; Grand Theatre de Geneva; Vlaamse Opera, Belgium; Castleward Opera, Belfast, Ireland; Opera Columbus; Connecticut Opera; Dayton Opera; Opera Theatre St. Louis, Minnesota Opera; Opera Ontario; Athens Festival, Theater Megaron; New York City Opera; Lake George Opera Festival; Opera North Carolina; Florentine Opera; Opera Omaha; Central City Opera; Colorado Opera Festival; and Opera Memphis and Fort Collins Opera.

Her students win competitions and sing at the Metropolitan Opera, Florida Grand Opera, Glimmerglass Opera, Munich Staatsoper, Lyric Opera of Chicago, Washington National Opera, Bayerische Staatsoper, Vienna Staatsoper, Netherlands Opera and Opera Norway as well as companies throughout the U.S.

She performed over 70 times with Luciano Pavarotti. A DVD "**A Tribute to Pavarotti: One Amazing Weekend in Petra**" features her performances and tribute to Pavarotti. She appeared in concert in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia, Lima, Peru, and Martingy, Switzerland.

Cynthia has directed *"II barbiere di Siviglia"* at UK; *Suor Angelica* for Opera Lucca, Italy, and UK as well as scenes and arias for Opera

Studio do Recife, Brazil; Chongqing Normal University, China and The American Opera Institute.

Cynthia has received teaching awards: "Kentucky Teachers who Make a Difference" and the National Society of Arts and Letters "Arts Teacher of the Year". She maintains a private studio. is a judge for the Metropolitan Opera National Council Auditions, and conducts Master Classes for singers, performers, and colleges.


